Post show discussions with the 'Storm Lantern' company and pupils took place in 10 of the schools and after the public performance.

Employment was created for 11 people: 1 producer/director, 1 writer, 1 set & costume designer, 1 lighting designer, 1 sound designer, 1 director, 3 actors, 2 stage managers and 1 assistant director. For two of those employed this was their first professional engagement.



STORM LANTERN is the first play commissioned by Strange Town as part of 'The Future is Unwritten', a three year programme of new plays for secondary schools which is funded by Thrive Edinburgh.

FEEDBACK:

From the Schools:

I really enjoyed *Storm Lantern*! The set was incredible! So simple yet it really conveyed the themes well and was very practical. I'd love to see *Storm Lantern* again!

As a theatre student the set was very detailed, the sounds were very engaging (including the speeches by Hitler), overall the acting was very good.

It is very interesting to see a different point of view for German people in WW2 and is very important that we know that German people were not all for the Nazi party. And it was very sad to see how some German people were treated for speaking out against Hitler.

The show was very entertaining, and it was very interesting to learn about parts of the war that we don't get taught in school. I thought the staging was really cool.

It was very interesting and very engaging and showed how young people have more power than they think and that even the smallest action can make a difference. And the simple staging made it really easy to follow with all the flashbacks and split stages.

A moment we believed was impactful and effective was Sophie's death off-stage where the lighting and sound made the death feel real.

The actors were incredible, really convincing.

Everything ran so smoothly, the transitions between scenes was really good and made me think about how I would do that in my own dramas.

Enjoyed the post show chat, especially learning about the role of each member of the company.

Made me realise there was a different way to present drama other than moving the set and using a blackout every time.

I'm grateful and appreciate that Strange Town could come into the school a put on a play for us. It was very detailed and it felt like we were in a theatre. The set they made is amazing, it was so cool to see our studio transform into a type of theatre. The post show chat with the cast and crew helped and they answered all questions in detail which helped to understand each role that everyone played. And the crew's description of their roles and their journey of becoming the stage manager, sound and lighting people, writer, director was very interesting to see which path they took. The story they portrayed throughout the performance was incredible and even though I hadn't heard of it before I felt like I knew the story during the play.

I really enjoyed it. Being able to see a play in school and not having to make a special trip or pay money was really convenient and fun. It gave me something to look forward to and was very enjoyable.

I thought the play was amazing and I enjoyed it a lot, I loved the set and thought that it really connected to the story it was really clever as it emphasises that they are in jail cells; the audience is able to imagine the rest of the people who have been arrested.
